

The posture of kneeling they ask us to adopt to strike their rim and make a sound (the posture of prayer could be forgot)




what is necessity?

as a time to wait and pause between moving here and there, a time to reflect, to ponder, and observe what surrounds.




Coffee sharpens the brain's pallet, wakens the receptors and heightens perception. It is a necessary medium for inspired conversation and contemplation.

and blankets, wool if possible rolled tight, are light and keep out damp.






A mural painted on scrap wood resembling a cave wall story, what is necessity?

A sense of humour and whimsy, gratitude and courage.


